



Wall Covering Care

Proper care of wall covering will help keep them looking their best.

Stains and paste on the surface should be removed as quickly as possible to eliminate any possible reaction between the staining agent and the wall covering.

Cleaning of the Wall Covering

- Normal cleaning of the wall covering should be done with mild ingredients such as soap, detergent and water. If stained and stronger cleaning is required, a liquid household cleaner should be used.
- Liquid cleaners should be low VOC content and non abrasive.
- Clean from the bottom of the wall upward to protect the baseboard and to prevent streaking. Rinse thoroughly with clean water from the top down using a sponge. Blot wall covering dry with a soft, lint-free towel.
- Try an inconspicuous spot first before attempting the entire wall. Always rinse the wall well after applying a detergent.
- Not recommended for cleaning are steel wool or powdered abrasive cleaners.
- Do not use active solvent-type cleaning preparations, such as nail polish remover, tar and bug removers, or liquid cleaners with a high alcohol content exceeding 50%.
- Repeated use of stronger cleaners will extract plasticizers from vinyl wall covering causing the mural to fail and lose its suppleness.

***Precautions:**

Excess soiling materials such as chewing gum, asphalt, crayons, paint, nail polish should be carefully scraped off prior to other cleaning attempts.
